A Message from the Clergy

The great blessing of these holidays is community. When we come together, hundreds of voices speak, sing, and pray as one. In addition, the High Holidays create for us a shared culture. They build a foundation



upon which we construct a healthy and holy society. They set a tone, provide shared language and set expectations for how we will act throughout the year. For example, the holidays make it acceptable and normal, praiseworthy even, to admit mistakes. To look failure straight in the eye. To reckon honestly and rigorously. To apologize and take responsibility. To make serious commitments to learning and growth. Doing this work in community allows us to do so without shame. It normalizes a deeply personal process and the impactful interpersonal results. When we seek forgiveness, it is in the context of our friends, our peers, and our family members doing the same. We are not isolated or alone as we identify our flaws and missteps. That is a great gift.

In a piece called Those Who Almost¹ Israeli poet David Shatner writes:

Be with those who almost made it to the train be with those who do not speak the language with those who had to get up tomorrow with those who got on the 18A bus in the wrong direction those whose shirt does not fit properly, how upsetting, those who have no reception those for whom no one ever waits those who are short-changed and those who can't find a parking spot, who don't find a job, those who don't find compassion those who are hungry who cry out who forgot something important those who became weary those who stopped be with those who almost

All of us, especially now, are "those who almost." We missed the mark this year, occasionally, because in an unkind or ungenerous moment, we chose to cause harm. More often, though, we missed the mark because the demands of day to day living simply got in the way. We stepped onto the (metaphorical) wrong bus. Finding our way back drained us of both energy and aspiration.

That is the reason we are here. We join the poet in asking the Holy One of Blessing to be with "those who almost" and to be with us.

All of us at Temple Israel of Hollywood are most grateful to spend this season with you. may our work strengthen us, our community, and our world.


